

USING YOUR VOUCHERS

Centenary Scheme Members will be issued with a Centenary Scheme Booklet which will hold your vouchers. The correct number of vouchers must be deducted from your booklet before play. All Centenary Scheme members and their guests must be signed in at the Professional's Shop. Failure to do so could result in your membership being withdrawn and any unused vouchers forfeited.

HANDICAP

All members are entitled to maintain their handicap at the Club. Mold Golf Club has a requirement that all members must have a golf handicap or obtain one within six months of joining the Club. If you don't have a current handicap, please see the Club Secretary Manager who will explain how to get one.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

Centenary Scheme Members may play in 6 nominated competitions which run from April to September (vouchers payable). Please see the Competition Notice Boards for information.

MEMBERSHIP

Centenary Scheme Members will have playing and social privileges but will not have any voting rights or be able to be elected to Committees or Club offices.

TRANSFER TO FULL MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY

Members may transfer to full membership at any time (subject to availability) The cost of unused vouchers will be deducted from the cost of full membership

TRANSFER FROM FULL MEMBERSHIP TO THE SCHEME

A maximum of five Current Full Members can transfer to the Scheme in the following year on a first come first served basis

APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

An application form should be completed and returned to the Secretary/Manager at Mold Golf Club.

On receipt, prospective members will be invited to an informal interview with the Club Captain and Secretary Manager. On payment they will become Centenary Scheme members

If you decide not to renew your Centenary Scheme membership you will lose your membership rights. You may however use the outstanding vouchers but they must be used by the 31st December in the year of your resignation.
